Organization: Al Qaeda ("The Base")

Background: Born in Saudi Arabia in 1957 to wealthy construction baron. In 1979, joined a group of mujihadeen headed to Afghanistan to oppose Soviet occupation. When U.S. troops were stationed in Saudi Arabia during the Gulf War, bin Laden became a vocal anti-U.S. activist. Stripped of Saudi citizenship, he used his ample wealth to set up training camps for Islamic militants who oppose U.S. and Israeli presence.

Suspected Activities:

- Truck bombs against U.S. targets in Middle East and Africa (Saudi Arabia in 1985, Kenya and Tanzania in 1998)
- Attempted bombings of LA, Seattle during millennium celebrations.
- Funded bombing of U.S.S. Cole (Yemen, 2000)
- Bombing of New York's World Trade Center and Washington, D.C. (2001)
